In his spare time, Josh enjoys cross-country skiing, hockey, fishing, tennis, mountain biking, and baseball.

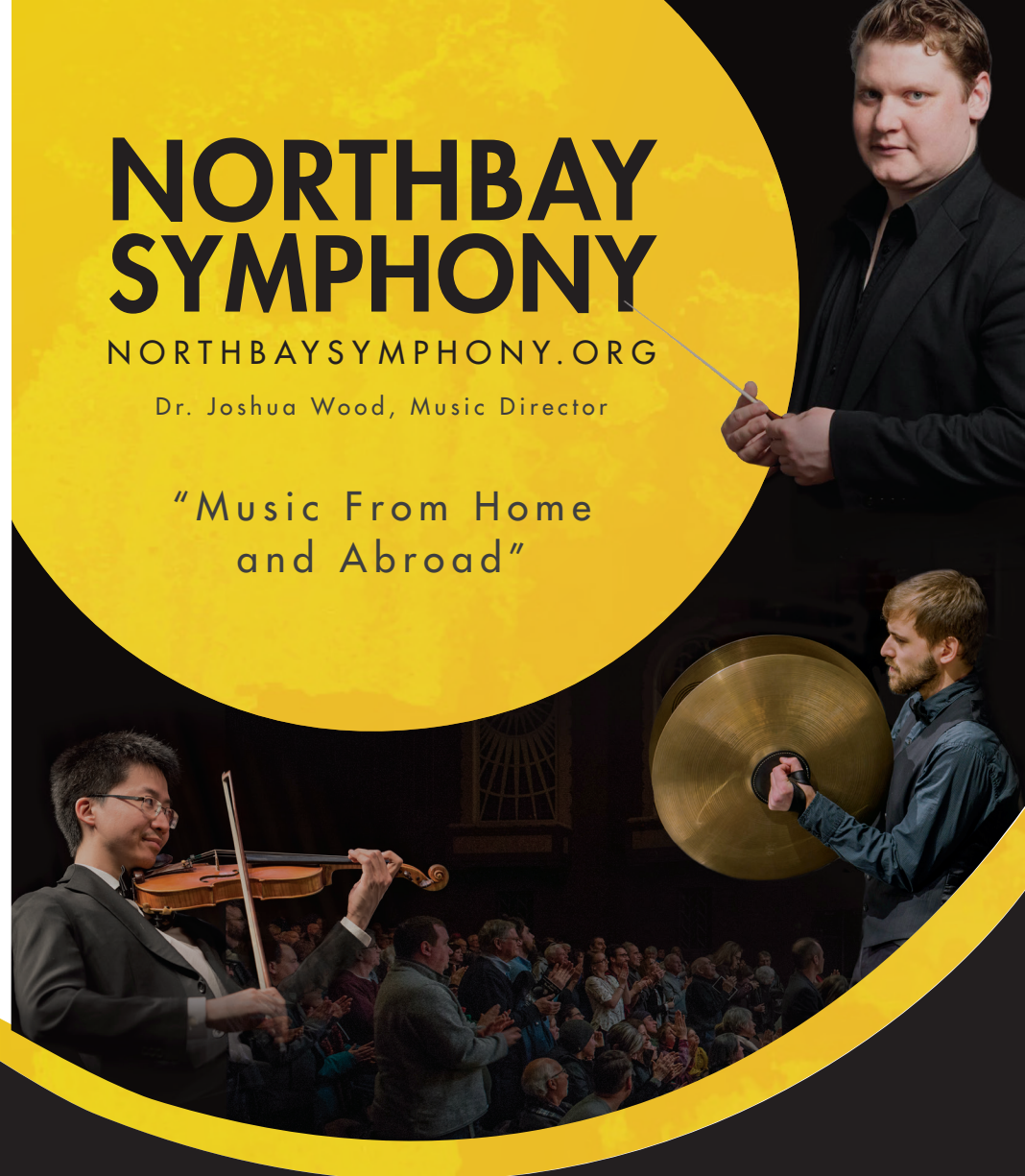
